## MUIR WOODS NATIONAL MONUMENT (MAIN TRAIL)

Muir Woods is a great place to take HDR photos, especially on a foggy day with early morning sun just barely penetrating through the fog and the trees.

Map of the Muir Woods area; we followed the main trail out and the Hillside Trail back:



Part of a redwood tree which lived for 1,021 years. The sign near the tree also has a 1897 quote from John Muir: "God has cared for these trees, saved them from drought, disease, avalanches, and a thousand straining, leveling tempests and floods; but he cannot save them from fools—only Uncle Sam can do that."





These four photos are of the beginning of our walk out the main trail through Muir Woods. Even in the summer, if you arrive early enough you can get photos of the trail without any people in them:









Young redwoods may sprout out of the still-living root system of a no-longer living redwood tree in a "fairy ring":
