
Canyon Between Stretched Pebble and Black Point East

Google Earth image of the canyon:



The canyon wash started out wide, but it soon narrowed down. Being an early morning in December, the sun was coming from directly up-canyon, making it difficult to take photos:





We quickly reached a 100 foot fall that had to be bypassed to continue further up canyon:



We backtracked down-canyon, then scrambled up to the ridge. We then followed the ridge until we could see into the canyon:





As you can see in the previous photo, the canyon appears to have a couple of dry falls after the big one before opening up again. We continued along the ridge to see if there was any way to drop back down into the canyon. The ridge in the bottom left of the photo below proved to be the best way to descend into the canyon. However, only the talus expert in our group chose to descend into the canyon to look around:
