

## “More Slots” Canyon

Google Earth route showing the route to this canyon compared to the route to Funeral Slot Canyon. We followed the wash (and that horse trail) on the way up, but we spotted another horse trail entering this canyon’s wash, so we followed that back:



The local coyote we spotted on our walk up the wash:

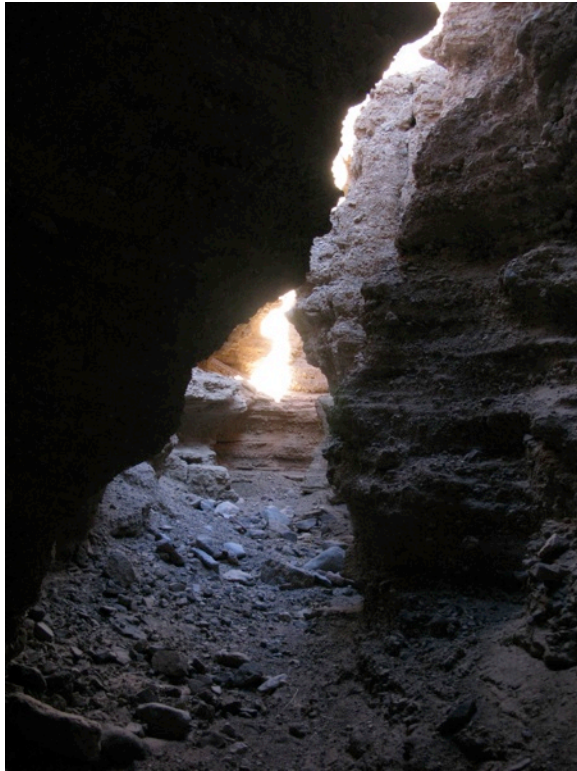
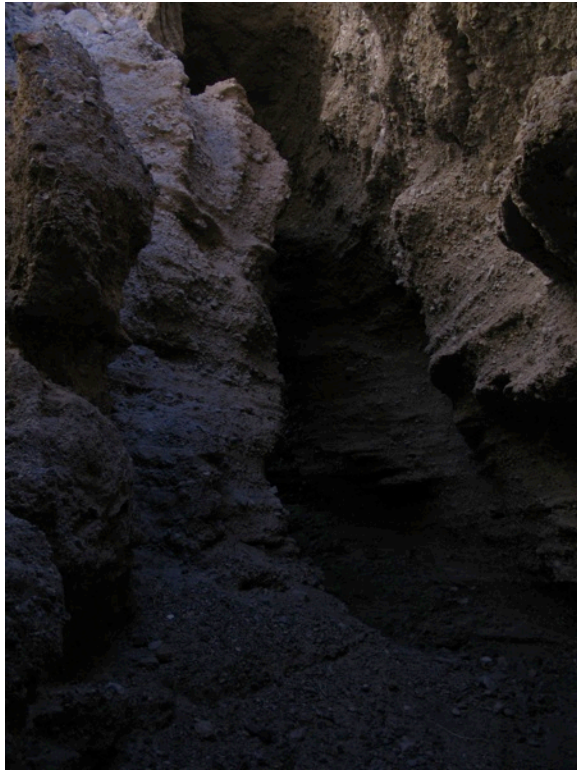


As we enter the main wash of the canyon, the walls start to close in:



A short but narrow slot on the left just before the canyon forks. The entrance is around a corner and not obvious, but the slot quickly narrows down before ending abruptly at a 15-foot, crumbly fall:





Approaching the fork in the canyon:



The left fork rounds a bend and then is stopped. From the Google Earth map, it looks likely that there are more slots past this fall:



We check out the right fork:



And find another short slot going off to the left that, again, ends abruptly at a large fall:



The main fork continues for a little while longer before it too stops at a fall:



We head back down the wash, then follow the horse trail that goes off the side of the wash to the west. Looking back at the horse trail where it joins the service road:



Following the service road back down to the Texas Springs Campground:
