





The walk up the wide wash of this canyon:



Up ahead, the canyon appeared to split:



The right (west) fork was a narrow slot, but it was fairly quickly blocked by a bunch of mud-boulders when it started getting steep:



When we left this right-fork, we noticed another, smaller slot-canyon further west, but this one too got steep quickly:





We found what appeared to be the remains of a car bumper and a cookstove on our way out of the slot:



Heading up the left fork, we quickly encountered what I will call this canyon's first set of mud-narrows, after a short open stretch:



When the canyon opened back up a little more before narrowing again into the second set of narrows, we noticed a small interesting slot canyon/cave, again on the west side:

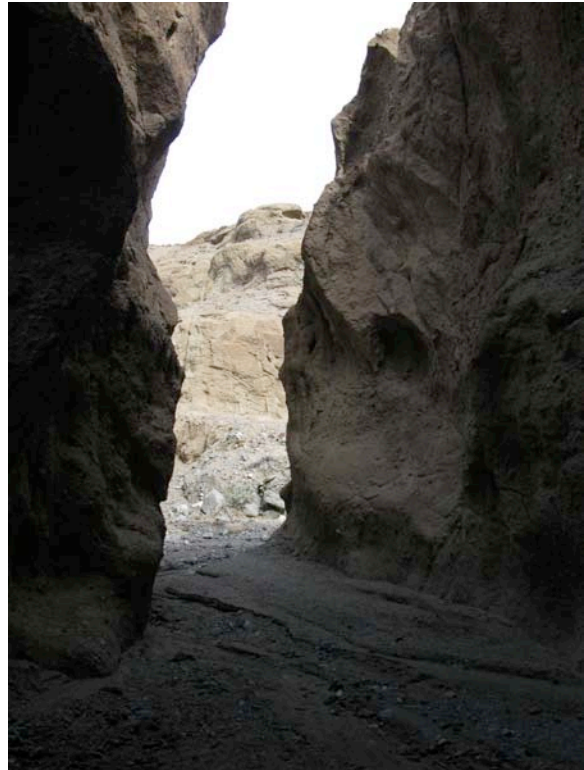


Looking back down-canyon at a small mud-boulder pile in the wash:





Then, we entered the more incredible second narrows:





The canyon opens up again for a short while, before narrowing down again into the third part of the narrows, which are not as deep or narrow as the second narrows. The third set of narrows could be counted as more than three, as the canyon opens up for short stretches then narrows back down for longer stretches, but I will call this whole length the third narrows as they are so similar. Continuing up-canyon through the seemingly endless narrows, which actually felt a lot shorter on the way back when we weren't stopping for as many photos:



Finally, the canyon becomes less narrow as we get closer to the mountains:



Then, we round a corner and encounter a fall, which would be easy to climb, but we were getting tired and still had a side canyon we had seen on the TOPO that we wanted to check out, so we turned around:



This is the slot leading to the side canyon:



It had a short narrow stretch:



Then, it encountered a two-stage 15-20 foot fall, which was climbable but not particularly easy (which I do not have a photo of). From there, we turned around and headed back down through the narrows. A nice arch on the wall in the narrows:





Looking back up the canyon at a point where it opens up quickly near the beginning of the narrows:
