

“Fall 2” Canyon

From the TOPO, it looks like both forks get steep, although Google Earth seems to show that it may be flatter in spots. Approaching the canyon mouth:



As the canyon rounds a big turn, it is reminiscent of Fall and Titus Canyons:

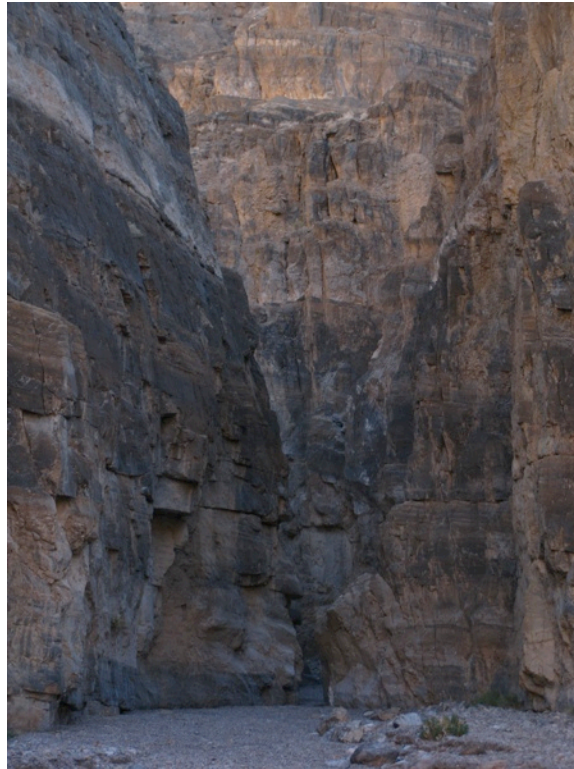




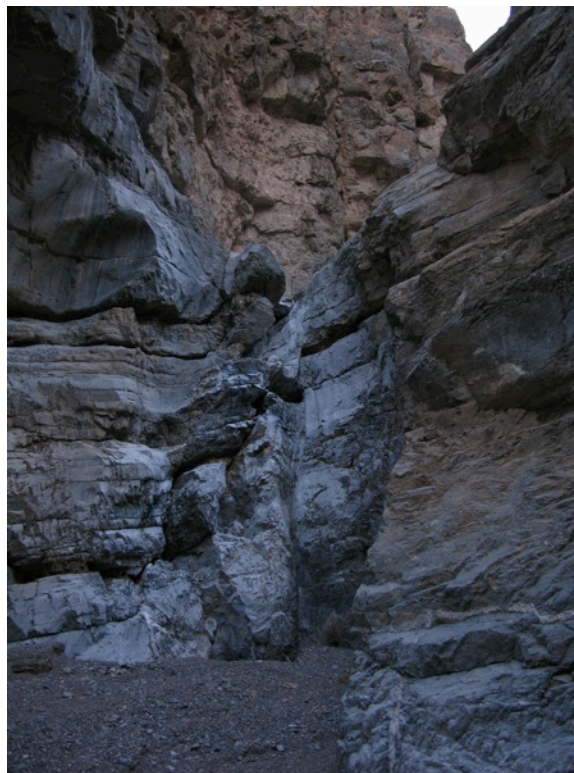
There is a short stretch where the canyon narrows down:



The canyon rounds another turn and enters some incredible narrows:



The narrows continue for a short ways before being interrupted by a 25-foot fall. One member of the group got to just below the chockstone before deciding it was too risky to continue. We also discovered that the rock is slick in places and it is easy to slip:



We looked for workarounds, since the canyon looks quite interesting past the fall, but we were unable to find any because the walls are so steep. However, we were able to get a little ways up the wall a few yards back down the canyon to see above the fall:
