WILDFLOWERS MARCH 2016

These are some assorted wildflower photos which didn't fit into the other reports from this March 2016 trip. We had unfortunately missed the peak of the "2016 Superbloom," but we were lucky enough to still see many nice wildflowers. In fact, the flowers we saw were generally bigger than I'd ever seen before, and we saw many types that I had previously never encountered.

Looking south down the Panamint Valley from the Ballarat Viewpoint on our drive in to the park; the southern Panamint Valley is an area which I have been hoping to explore for many years but haven't gotten to it yet:

The most prevalent flower in this area at this time seemed to be the Golden Evening Primrose:
